### Good morning to everyone

First let me make apologies for our President and CEO, on whose behalf I am delivering these remarks, as he had a scheduling conflict and was unable to join us this morning. He sends his best regards.

I am happy you've joined us this morning as we launch another initiative under our Corporate Social Responsibility programme.

This initiative is called Helping Hands and it adds another dimension to how we Live Our Vision Everyday, or LOVE at Sagicor. As the name suggests, this programme will seek to give a helping hand to non-governmental organisations (NGOs) across the Caribbean.
